NEED:

MORE oculofacial plastic and orbital surgery

RESPONSE:

NEW oculofacial plastics fellowship

1 year fellowship:

- *Functional, reconstructive and aesthetic procedures
- *It takes place in the largest public ophthalmological hospital, International rotation in Bascom Palmer Hospital and Central Florida Eye Specialist
- *The application is done online
- *There is daily contact with patients and the opportunity to perform different types of surgical techniques
- *Participation of different mentors from the United States, Mexico and Honduras allows for rich learning full of different details in each surgical technique.

*There is a stipend received monthly

MY EXPERIENCE:

- More than 700 individual procedures
- In the Fellowship we did surgeries such as blepharoplasties, ectropion and ectropion correction, ptosis, skin/orbital biopsy, reconstructions, among others.
- This year is full of learning, advice and opportunities to improve the patient's quality of life.


Location of Fellowship Hospital San Felipe, Tegucigalpa, Honduras

GLOBAL HEALTH IMPACT

* Increasing access to timely care, diagnostic tests, and medical-surgical treatments for patients in need of Oculofacial Plastic Surgery, without discrimination based on economic status, origin, race, gender, or age in Honduras.

CHALLENGES

- · One public hospital in the entire country
 - Patients need to travel more than 8 hours to attend
 - · Surgery can take months or years to be scheduled.
- Limited access to all the necessary equipment
- Untrained staff
- No available OR during extended hours

PATH FORWARD

- Well-trained support team
- EMR with better access to digital files
- Better access to higher level equipment and instruments
- Increased number of doctors trained in oculoplastics and facial surgery
